- English Grammar Connection: Adjectives are words that describe nouns.
 In English, the adjective almost always comes before the noun. In Spanish, the adjective usually comes after the noun.

the **serious** students vs. los estudiantes **serios**

- In Spanish, adjectives match the gender and number of the nouns they describe.

Here's How

	Singular	Plural
Masculine	El chic <u>o</u> alt <u>o</u>	Los chic <u>os</u> alt <u>os</u>
Feminine	La chic <u>a</u> alta	Las chic <u>as</u> alt <u>as</u>

- Adjectives that end in -e match both genders.
- Many adjectives that end in a consonant match both genders.
- Some adjectives that end in a consonant add -a to form the feminine singular. These exceptions have to be memorized.
- To make an adjective plural, add -s if it ends in a vowel; add -es if it ends in a consonant.
