- In Spanish, articles match nouns in <u>gender</u> and <u>number</u>.

 Here's how: ALL Spanish nouns, even if they refer to <u>Objects</u>, are either masculine or <u>feminine</u>.
 - --Nouns ending in __O _ are usually masculine.
 - --Nouns ending in ___ are usually feminine.
